### **2017 GENERAL RULES**

**Read carefully – Rules have changed**

#### **PLEASE TAKE NOTE:**

**All entry forms will be required to be mailed to and received at the Supervisor's address at 48 Perine St., Dansville, NY 14437 by Friday, July 7, 2017. Absolutely NO Entry Forms will be accepted after this date. This change will provide the staff time enough to fill out entry tags one week prior to the fair and provide packets of entry tickets efficiently to entrants on Monday and Tuesday of fair week.** Actual entries will be accepted on Monday, 10am until 7pm. Food, Flower and Vegetable entries will be accepted on Tuesday, 10am until 12pm. Building hours will be 10am until 9pm Tuesday through Saturday of the fair week. Judging will be held Tuesday afternoon and will be completed by Wednesday, 10am.

The annual Viewer's Choice Awards will be awarded at 5 pm on Friday of the fair week. All adult entries in Department D will be included in the competition. The general public will decide the winners, (Reserve and Champion), based on the number of ticket votes cast. One ticket per visitor to the Home Arts Building will be given out free of charge each day.

1. Each exhibitor must pay an entry fee of 10% of the first premium (ie, if \$4.00 then it is \$ .40). The exhibitor must purchase a \$5.00 exhibitor ticket. This does not apply to junior exhibitors (12 and under). See rule 9.
2. Only one entry per class per person.
3. No article, unless deemed worthy by the judges, will receive a premium whether there is competition or not. **DECISION OF THE JUDGE IS FINAL.**
4. All exhibits must be left in place until Saturday 9pm. Exhibits can be picked up after 9pm Saturday or Sunday morning between 9am and 11am. **NO EXCEPTIONS!!**
5. Premiums will be paid in **CASH** when the item(s) are picked up. **ATTENTION horticulture and food entries: If you have premiums due you must come to one of the pick-up times listed even though your entries will not be retrieved. NO PREMIUMS WILL BE MAILED!!!**  
**ALL PREMIUMS NOT PICKED UP BY SUNDAY AT 11am WILL BE FORFEITED TO THE HOME ARTS DEPARTMENT TO BE USED AT THEIR DISCRETION.**
6. **All efforts are made to safeguard exhibits, but the Fair Association assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damage. It is understood that all articles are entered at owner's risk.**
7. Nothing can be entered in *unlisted* if there is a class listed for that entry.

8. All exhibits must be entered in the name of the exhibitor and made within the past two years.
9. Anyone 12 or under may enter any class. They will be given an exhibitor's ticket, but must pay 10% of the premium to enter. **The junior exhibits will be judged on the merits of the project entered. Age must be noted on entry form. All other rules apply.**
10. **Entry forms must be completed by exhibitors prior to turning in exhibits. NO forms will be completed by fair staff. See example entry form on display.**
11. **READ ALL INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY, ESPECIALLY IF IT STATES "MUST OR SHOULD". NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE FOR NOT FOLLOWING THE WRITTEN RULES.**
12. **BE SURE YOUR CHOICE OF CLASS ENTRY/ENTRIES IS CORRECT. NO CHANGES WILL BE MADE BY STAFF ONCE RECEIVED.**

### Standards for Divisions 1 – 4

1. Careful construction, presentation, clean, well pressed, neatly folded or hung. Suitability to intended use.
2. Material: appropriate in quality and color.
3. Thread: appropriate quality, size and color.
4. Workmanship: Stitches and edges smooth and even. Stitches of appropriate length.
5. Finishing: Back of article neat, corners well made and ends of thread properly held in place.
6. No article previously receiving a premium will be accepted for entry.
7. **A card briefly describing the item must be submitted along with the item; Details could include things like type of yarn/stitch used, fiber content, origins of the pattern, etc.**
