Entries will close at 8:00 pm Monday (Tues. 11:00 am for foods, cut flowers and vegetables). The building will open at 9:00 am both days and thereafter the building hours will be 10:00am to 9:00 pm

NO entry will be accepted later. Judging to begin Tuesday.

GENERAL RULES

1. Each exhibitor must pay an entry fee of 10% of the first premium and purchase an exhibitors ticket. This does not apply to Junior exhibitors (16 and under). See rule 8.
2. Only one entry per class per person.
3. No article, unless deemed worthy by the judges, will receive a premium whether there is competition or not. **DECISION OF THE JUDGE IS FINAL.**
4. All exhibits must be left in place until Saturday 9:00 pm. If you are unable to pick up your exhibits at 9:00 pm, arrangements should be made ahead of time.
5. All efforts are made to safeguard exhibits, but the Fair Association assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damage. It is understood that all articles are entered at owner's risk.
6. Nothing can be entered in *unlisted* if there is a class listed for that entry.
7. All exhibits must be entered in the name of the exhibitor and made within the past two years.
8. Anyone 16 or under may enter any class in Divisions I – VII. They are not required to buy an exhibitors ticket, but must pay 10% of the premium to enter. **The junior exhibits will be judged on the merits of the project entered. Age must be noted on entry form. All other rules apply.**

Standards for Handmade Articles:

- General appearance: Simple in design and construction, clean, well-pressed, neatly folded or hung.
- Material appropriate in design, quality and color.
- Finished ready to be used.
- No article previously receiving a premium will be accepted for entry.
